## **RUSA: Academic and Developmental Activities**

Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) (Hindi for "National Higher Education Mission") is a holistic scheme of development for higher education in India initiated by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India which aims at providing strategic funding to the eligible state higher educational institution. Our college follows the H.P.U. concept of CBCS (Choice Based Credit System). The CBCS is an instructional package developed to suit the needs of the students to keep pace with the developments in the higher education worldwide. Further under the scheme of strategic funding the works, viz. , Conference Hall (amount Rs. 1314177) Play Ground (amount of Rs. 3780300/-) Toilet block (amount of Rs. 2044500/-) various renovations (amounting to Rs. 2629179/-), purchase of equipments (amounting to Rs. 3753425/-) were executed through Govt. agencies (HPPWD/HIMUDA/BSNL) under RUSA "Infrastructure Grants to the Colleges" *Departments of BBA/BCA & PGDCA* 

The Departments of BBA, BCA and PGDCA under the Co-ordinatorship of Prof. Karan Singh Pathania and Dr. Ruchi Sharma respectively, conducted several activities along with academics, where students are being groomed in order to meet the challenges of rapidly changing business in the globalized world.

Many interesting academic and co-curricular activities were planned and conducted during the current academic year.
