Admission Process

- 1. The candidate seeking admission in the college has to apply online at http://www.gcdhaliara.in
- 2. The students can approach the College **Guidance and Counselling Committee** in case they find any difficulty in filling up of the admission form during the college hours.
- 3. The merit lists will be displayed as per schedule mentioned in the prospectus.
- 4. After getting the approved admission form, applicants are advised to deposit their fee online by using UPIs (BHIM/Google Pay/PhonePe/ Paytm)/Mobile/Internet Banking.

Documents Required to Be Uploaded with the Form

- 5. Matriculation certificate for Date of Birth.
- 6. 10+2markssheet.
- 7. H.P. Domicile certificate for girl students (for exemption in tuition fee).
- 8. Minimum 40% disability certificate, sports/cultural quota and category certificate in case of students seeking admission against the seats.
- Original character certificate from Head of the Institution last attended. In case of private candidates, the character certificate must have been issued by a Gazetted officer/ Panchayat Pradhan/ Ward Counsellor but not older than 6 months from the day of submission of admission form.
- 10. For seat against the 'single girl child category' an Affidavit proclaiming the same from the parents is to be submitted with the admission form.
- 11. A student seeking admission from Board/University other than H.P. will have to upload the copy of migration certificate and the original certificate has to be submitted at the time of counselling.
- 12. Affidavits should be provided wherever applicable.
- 13. Certificate of SC/ ST from Magistrate Class-1 (Authorized Signatory) should be provided by those seeking relaxation in age/ marks.
- 14. Any gap (latest) in the academic career of the applicant must be supported by a documentary evidence/affidavit as proof of his/ her activities during the period of gap.

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ABOUT INSTITUTION

Established in July, 1973 in the name of Thakur Kesho Dass, the college was taken over by the H.P.Govt. In August, 1984 and rechristened as Govt. College, Dhaliara. 1.DEPARTMENT OF MANAGEMENT STUDIES

Every year, after the completion of 12th exams in March many students is becoming busy choosing their career options and searching for various courses and their admission procedures. BBA is one of the courses that creates new avenues for students after 12th. The aim of a BBA course is to inject basic management skills to students. The BBA degree imparts basic management and business skills to the students seeking a bright career in future. After taking admission to BBA course, a student can be a leader for tomorrow. The BBA course is structured in such a way so that it helps students learn basic management skills and effective communication skills as well. Bachelor's degree programs in business administration/business studies/management studies are called by various names by the different universities. Hence, you are likely to came across BBA, BBS, MBA courses, all of which are more or less the same thing.

What is BBA?

Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) is a three-year fulltime course that is designed to give rise to future professionals, rather than mere 'degree holders. This course keeps in mind the needs of the industry where the students would ultimately find employment, and, therefore, has a completely different approach to learning.

WHY is BBA better than any other conventional degree?

Answer lies in three points: -

- (a) A professional course: BBA goes beyond bookish knowledge. Instead, it sharpens students managerial skill through organizing Management Fest, presentations, Ad-Mad, case studies, industry visits, guest lectures by professionals etc. that helps students to deal with real life situation better.
- **(b)A Structured Syllabus:** Maximum subjects taught in BBA course, be it areas of management like marketing, finance systems, human resource management etc. Theoretical concepts learnt in the classroom are supported by practical experience in the form of projects, presentations, industry visits and summer placements, thereby making the course a complete learning experience.
- (c)An edge over other undergraduate courses: The limited number of seats in the BBA means that only the best students get selected. They are then trained by some of the finest faculty members. Add to this, the guest lectures delivered by industry experts, and you know that BBA graduates have a definite edge over others.

What after BBA?

The obvious choice after BBA in opting for postgraduation----an MBA. Having a prior knowledge of different aspects of management, BBA graduates often find it easier to crack MBA entrance exams, as compared to other graduates. After completing the BBA course students also have the option of joining MNC's as a management trainee/ executive trainee/sales specialist/ in any of the following sectors. Banking, Consultancy, Finance, IT Companies, Advertising Agencies etc. or carry their **own company** to next height of success for those students, who don't want to go for an MBA directly, there are abundant career opportunities after BBA. So go ahead.

2.BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

2.1Seats, Eligibility Condition, Age limit, Basis of Admission, Promotion and Reservation

The duration of BBA is three years, spread over six semesters. There shall be an examination at the end of each semester. The total number of seats in BBA course is proposed 60, distributed as under.

2.2 ELIGIBILITY CONDITION

Plus two Examination with any stream under 10+2 system or other examination equivalent thereto of a Board/University Established by law in India with at least 45% marks (40% in case of SC/ST Candidates). Or

Any examination of a Board/University/College/School in a foreign country recognized as equivalent for the purpose of eligibility by the Vice-Chancellor/Equivalent Committee or on the recommendation of Association of Indian Universities. AIU House, 16 Kotla Marg, New Delhi.

2.3 AGE LIMIT

The maximum age limit for admission is 23 years as on 1st July of 2021. However, in case of candidates belonging to SC/ST categories the upper age limit will be raised by three years i.e., 26 years as on 1st July of 2021. The Vice – Chancellor shall have the power to permit age relaxation for reasons to be recorded in writing, up to maximum period of three months.

2.4 BASIS OF ADMISSION

2.4.1 Subsidised Seats:

Admission shall be made on the basis of merit list determined on the basis of marks obtained in Matriculation and +2 examinations. A candidate with Commerce or Mathematics at +2 level will be given additional 10% of the percentage marks obtained in +2, while computing merit for Admission .75% of seats shall be reserved for those who have passed their qualifying examinations from H.P.Board of School Education/H.P.University.

2.4.2 Non-Subsidised Seats:

Non-Subsidised Seats will be filled on the basis of First Come First Served.

This applies only to NRIs Payment Categories. In case of NRIs, this scheme admits students as per the merit in the past examinations passed by the candidate. Top 10 NRIs candidates shall be admitted to this programme.

Proof of status in the case of NRIs. For this purpose, either of the following documents shall be considered as a proper proof:

- (A) Copy of the Non-resident card/Employment card issued by the employers.
- (B) Photocopy of the immigration card/employment VISA entry on the passport along with details of passport.
- (C) Certificate issued by Indian Embassy/high commission in the country where NRI residing.
 - (D) Photocopy of the latest assessment order of income Tax Authorities either in India or the country of Employment filled in the status of NRI.

In case of non-availability of NRIs, the seats under non-subsidised category will be filled on First Come First Served.

2.4.3 To Resolve A Tie:

(A) In case of tie, the candidate having higher aggregate marks in the qualifying examination shall be admitted first.

(B)If the tie is still not resolved the candidate younger in age will be admitted first.

2.4.4 RESERVATION OF SEATS

- (i) ReservationRoster200-Pointasapprovedbythe State Government will be applicable.
- (ii) Totalmanagementseatswillbe10%oftheseatsforHimachaliBonafidecandidatesi.e.10%of42 seats in case of 50 seats and 10% of 85 seats in case of 100 seats allotted to the Colleges as per Orders of the Hon'ble High Court of H.P. vide CWP No.4500 of 2009 dated July 29, 2010. The management seats will be filled up by the management of Institute on the basis of merit of the Entrance Test through its own counselling in a transparent manner. There shall be no reservation, whatsoever, in respect of the prescribed management quota seats. The basic eligibility criteria shall remain the same as in case of other students.

DEPARTMENT OF COMPUTER SCIENCE

3.1 BACHELOR OF COMPUTER APPLICATION (BCA)

3.1.1 Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA) scheme of examinations:-

- a) The Duration of BCA shall be three years split over six semesters.
- b) There shall be an examination at the end of each semester in the month of April and October on the dates to be notified by the Controller of Examinations.
- c). The courses of study and syllabi shall be as pre-scribed by the Board of Studies/Faculty from time to time. Other rules will be similar to those for the corresponding examinations in the University.
- d). Pass percentage of marks: The pass marks in each paper shall be 40%.
- e). A candidate should have passed at least 50% marks of 1st year i.e. 1st and 2nd semester to get admission to 3rd semester of 2nd year and pass in 50% papers of 1st and 2nd year shall determine the eligibility for admission to 5th semester of 3rd year.
- f). A candidate obtaining pass marks in any course shall not be required to re-appear in that course again however the candidate shall be required to complete his BCA Degree within at a maximum of five years.
- g). The successful candidates shall be classified in three divisions as under:
 - i) First Division: Those who obtains 60% or more of the aggregate marks.
 - ii) Second Division: Those who obtain 50% or more but less than 60% of the aggregate marks.
 - iii) Third Division: Those who obtain less than 50% of the aggregate marks.

3.1.2 ELIGIBILITY

Candidates who have passed 10+2 examination from H.P. Board/CBSE/ICSE or any other examination considered equivalent to 10+2, by the Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla-5 with 40% Marks(35% marks for SC/ST category) shall be eligible.

Maximum age limit for admission to BCA course is 21 years for general category and 24 years for SC/ST category and 23 years for girls candidates as on the 1st July of the year concerned. The Vice Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to maximum of three months.

3.1.3 BASIS OF ADMISSION

Mode of Selection

The admission to BCA course will be made on the basis of merit of the qualifying examination. As per HP University rules 75% seats will be filled out of the candidates who have passed their 10+2 examination form the school situated in the Himachal Pradesh irrespective of the Board. Remaining 25% seats will be filled on all India basis. Other reservation rules of H.P. University shall be applicable. BCA is three years degree course based on Semester of examination.

Subsidised Seats

The admission to BCA course will be made on the basis of merit of the qualifying examination.

Non-Subsidised Seats

This applies only to NRIs Payment Category. In case of NRIs, this scheme admits students as per the merit in the qualifying examinations passed (10+2)by the candidate from H.P. Board of School Education or any other school located within the territorial jurisdiction of H.P. of any other school board e.g. CBSE or ICSE etc.

Proof of status in the case of NRIs: For this purpose, either of the following documents shall be considered as a proper proof:

- (a) Copy of the Non-resident card/Employment card issued by the employers.
- (b) Photocopy of the immigration card/employment VISA entry on the passport along with details of passport.
- (c) Certificate issued by Indian Embassy/high commission in the country where NRI residing.
- (d) Photocopy of the latest assessment order of income Tax Authorities either in India or the country of Employment filled in the status of NRIs.

In case of non-availability of NRIs, the seats under non-subsidised category will be filled as per the consolidated merit list. No reservation of any kind will be given under this category.

To Resolve a Tie:-

In case of tie the candidate younger in age will be admitted first.

3.1.4 RESERVATION OF SEATS

Admission to the course shall be subject to the following conditions:

- (a) 15% and 7.5% seats shall be reserved for SC and ST candidates respectively, who have passed their qualifying examination from H.P. Board of School Education or any other school located within the territorial jurisdiction of H.P. of any other school board e.g. CBSE or ICSE etc.
- (b) The remaining 77.5% seats shall be filled as under:-
 - (i) 25% of the seats for admission shall be open for all the candidates irrespective of the institution from where they have passed their qualifying examination.
 - (ii) 75% of the seats shall be filled out of the candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from H.P. Board of School Education or any other school located within the territorial jurisdiction of H.P. or any other school boards e.g. CBSE or ICSE etc.
 - (a)5% of the seats shall be reserved for outstanding sportsmen/women.

2 sports seats shall be filled according to following rules:

- 1. Sportsmen / Women seeking admission to BCA Department of the University in a Post-Graduate Degree Course /Diploma Course should be eligible to play in the Inter-College / Inter-University Championship as per rules and regulations for Inter- University Tournaments.
- 2. Admission against outstanding sports quota would be made once in the beginning of the academic session. No forms for such admission would be entertained after the expiry of the last date of the submission of forms for admission in the University.
- 3. Only those Sportsmen/Women would be considered for admission against outstanding sports quota, who have represented the University or State in the Inter-University or Inter-State Championship Tournaments respectively.
- 4. The Sportsmen/Women seeking admission against outstanding sports quota should also qualify the minimum eligibility conditions for admission in that course as provided under the rules.

5. In order to judge the suitability of players for admission in the sports quota, trials would be held in the respective games / sports, by a Committee to be constituted by the Director of Physical Education and Youth Programmes, who will be the Chairman of the Committee and the recommendation of the committee would be kept in view while giving admission. The original certificates would also be seen by the Committee at the time of trials. In case, a certificate is issued on the Association pad, it should be duly signed and stamped by both the President and the Secretary of the respective Association.

6. The admission against sports quota would be given to such candidates who have represented the University state in the inter- university/inter State competition in the following games.

Men's Section:

Hockey, Football, Volleyball, Basketball, Kabaddi, Wrestling, Boxing, Table Tennis, Badminton, Cross- Country, Cricket, Athletics, Weight Lifting, Handball, Chess, Kho-Kho, Judo, Taikwondo and other games included in the list of Inter College tournaments by the Sports & Cocurricular Activities Council of H.P.University from time to time.

Women's Section:

Hockey, Athletics, Basketball, Volleyball, Table Tennis, Badminton, Kho-Kho, Kabaddi Hand Ball, weightlifting, Boxing, Cross-Country Judo, Chess Taikwondo and other games included in the list of Inter College tournaments by the Sports & Co-curricular Activities Council of H.P.University from time to time.

- 7. For students who are given admission on sports basis, it will be compulsory to attend the sports activities (in his/her sport) regularly.
- 8. Any student who without adequate reasons is found to be avoiding his / her games / sports activities, will be liable for disciplinary action, leading to the cancellation of his / her admission.
- (b) 5% of the seats shall be reserved for outstanding cultural activists.

2 cultural seats shall be filled according to the following rules:

- 1. Admission against outstanding cultural quota at par with sports quota would be made once, in the beginning of the academic session. No forms for such admission would be entertained after the expiry of the last date of the submission of forms for admission in the University.
- 2. Candidates who are employed are not eligible for admission against cultural quota in any of the courses.
- 3. Only those students will be eligible for admission against outstanding cultural quota who are having at least I, II, III in Inter-School Cultural Competition in any of the previous three years.
- 4. While considering admissions against cultural quota only the following cultural items will be considered:

(1) Debate (2) Indian Folk Dance (3) Indian Classical Music (Vocal)(4) Indian Classical Music (Instrumental) (5) Light Vocal Music (6) Vadya Vadan (7) Group Singing (8) Indian Classical Dance (9) One Act Play/Short Play/Skit (10) Symposium (11) Poetic Symposium (12)Spot Painting and(13) Quizzing, Western Group Song, Western Solo, Rangoli, Clay Modelling, Elocution, Poetic Recitation, Cartooning, Collage, Poster Making Photography, Folk Dance, Orchestra and mimicry.

Note: The Distinction in the individual item will be given preference over the Team Items. The students seeking admission against outstanding cultural quota should also qualify the minimum eligibility condition for admission in that course provided under rules.

- 5. For students who are given admission on cultural quota basis it will be compulsory to represent the Himachal Pradesh University in cultural activities.
- 6. Any student who without adequate reason is found to be avoiding his / her cultural activity, will be liable for disciplinary action leading to the cancellation of his/her admission.
- 7. In order to judge the suitability of the candidates for admission against cultural quota, trials would be held in the respective cultural items by a Committee comprising co-ordinators and two persons to be nominated by the Principal and the recommendations of the committee will be final. Original certificates would be seen by the Committee at the time of trials.
- 8. As per the Hon'ble High Court in case No.642 of 2006, Abhishek V/s Himachal Pradesh the admission under cultural quota will be made on the basis of marks obtained in Entrance Test/qualifying examination. The trials would be held to judge the suitability of the candidates only. For the selection under cultural quota, those candidates are entitled to be admitted in the course, who possess higher merit in the entrance test/ qualifying examination than others.
- (c) 3% of the seats shall be reserved for physically challenged candidates.
- (d) Any other reservation rules of HPU shall be applicable if no suitable sportsman, cultural candidate and physically challenged candidate is available than the seat/seats will be offered to general category.

The H.P.University 200 points roaster is being followed for admission to BCA and reservation of various categories for the session 2021-22.

5. SCHOLARSHIPS

Extract of Himachal Pradesh Educational Institutions (prohibition of Ragging) Act 2009

- 1. (c) 'Ragging' means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power of senior students, former students or outsiders, is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or who are in any way considered junior by other students and includes individual or collective act of practices which
 - i) Involve physical or psychological assault or threat or use of force or wrongful confinement or regtraint; or
 - ii) Violate the status, dignity and honour of such students; or
 - iii) Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self esteem;
 - iv) Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gesture and obscene behavior.
- 2. (1) No person shall practice ragging in any form, within or outside the premises of an educational institution.
 - (2) Any person who contravenes the provisions of sub-section (1) shall, on conviction be punished with imprisonment for a term which may be extended to 3 years or with fifty thousand rupees or with both.
- 3. Every offence under this act shall be cognizable, non-bail able and compoundable with permission of the court.
- 4. (1) Any student convicted of an offence under this act shall be expelled from the educational institution.
- (2) Student expelled under sub-section (1) or expelled otherwise on account of ragging shall not be admitted in any other educational institute for a period of three years from the date of such expulsion.
